CBN honours God and thanks partners for 50 years of broadcasting

CBN celebrated a major milestone on October 1, 2011, marking the 50th anniversary of the ministry's first television broadcast. To honour God for His faithfulness, CBN held a service of thanksgiving in front of the Studio Headquarters Building.

Pat Robertson recalled how he started CBN with just a few dollars in his pocket and a large vision in his heart: "God called me to come down here. He said, 'I want you to claim the airwaves and take them from the prince of the power of the air and give them to the Prince of Peace.'"

CBN's first broadcast on October 1, 1961, barely reached the city limits of Portsmouth, Virginia. Today, thanks to dedicated partners like you, CBN is spreading the Gospel around the globe.

During the anniversary ceremony, the mayors of Virginia Beach and Chesapeake each gave a proclamation honouring CBN's achievements over the past half century.

Virginia Governor Bob McDonnell, a graduate of Regent University, said in his tribute, "There are so few celebrations like this, where, 50 years from the inception of an organization, the founder is still here, still on the job, still leading with the same vision that gave birth to the organization some 50 years ago."

Keynote speaker Reinhard Bonnke, an internationally renowned evangelist, issued a stirring challenge for Christians everywhere to rededicate themselves to winning the world to Christ: "I believe what we have heard today and seen today with CBN and the ministry of Pat Robertson is going to multiply. He will be looked upon as a forerunner of a new generation."

Similarly, Congressman Randy Forbes of Virginia's Fourth District said in his note of congratulations: "I truly believe that eyes have not seen, nor ears have heard, the amazing things that God has in store for The Christian Broadcasting Network. Even greater works lie ahead."

Although he was pulled out and temporarily resuscitated, his prognosis was grim and he lapsed into a coma. See how his amazing story unfolds.



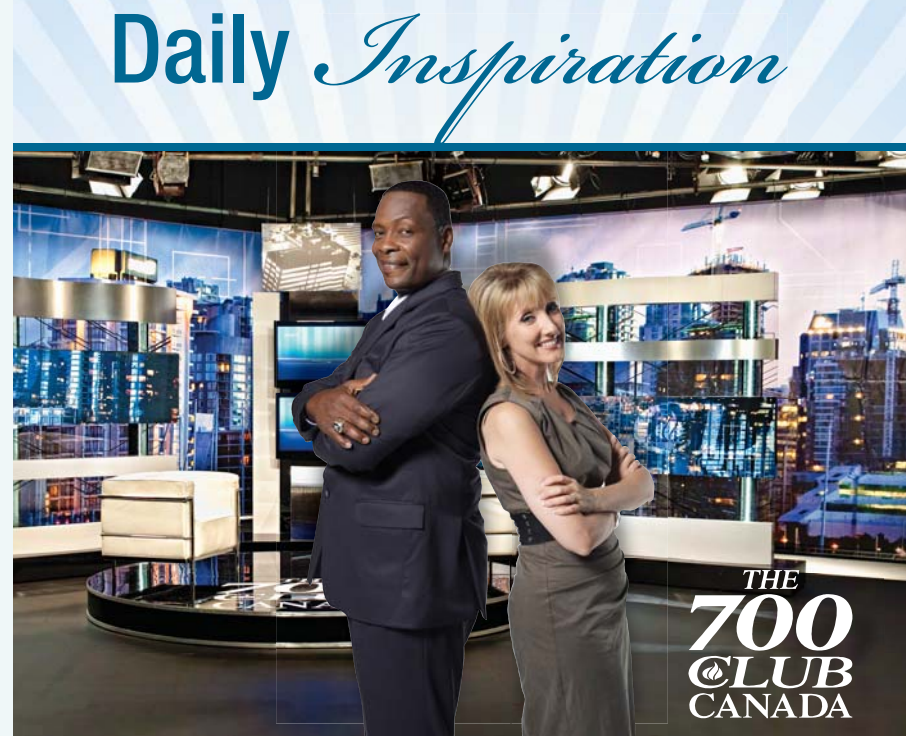

Trade Your Anxiety for Thanksgiving *A key to God's peace*

Do you ever find yourself worrying? Philippians 4:6 tells us, *Do not be anxious about anything.* This is written by Paul, who was beaten, shipwrecked, jailed, whipped, and stoned nearly to death. How can he say not to be anxious about anything? "Anything" includes the past, the present and the future, your family, your finances and your job. Don't worry about any of it!



The verse continues: *But in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.* The antidote for worry and fear is talking to God about your concerns—and then giving Him thanks and praise for all He has done.

Acts 16 describes how Paul and Silas are whipped, put in stocks, and locked in a dungeon. Instead of complaining, they sing hymns and praise God! And what happens? *Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everybody's chains came loose* (v. 26). The terrified jailer falls down at Paul's feet and asks, *"What must I do to be saved?"* (v. 30). Paul then leads the man and his entire household to the Lord.

When you have a concern, don't bury it deep down inside so it eats at you and keeps you up at night. You can never complain your way out of a problem. Instead, let it be known to God with thanksgiving. Start thanking God in advance for the answer.

And as Paul goes on to say in Philippians 4:7, *The peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.* God bless you!

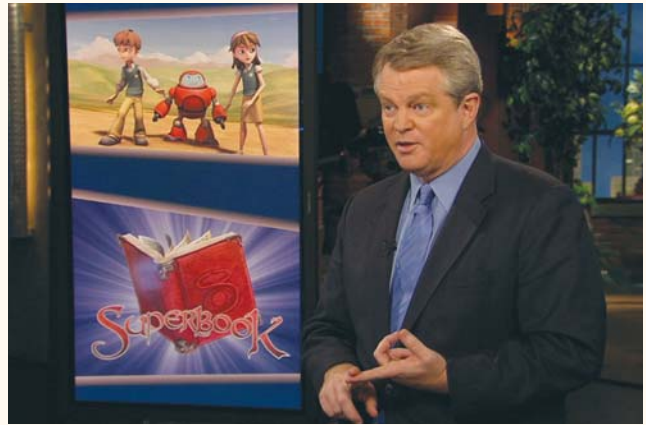

Raising Bully-Proof Kids

Teach your child to be strong—and nice

Paul Coughlin, author and founder of an anti-bullying ministry called The Protectors, spoke with Terry Meeuwse on *The 700 Club* about what every parent can do to shape confident and virtuous children.

In Coughlin's book, *Raising Bully-Proof Kids*, he explains how fearful parents, mistreatment of anger, and cautious living lead to underdeveloped, anxious children. Instead of teaching children to be compliant, he shows parents how to enable them to live strong in a tough world. Coughlin's program is built on five core principles found throughout the Bible.

1. The power of clarity: seeing reality clearly and knowing the truth about self, relationships and boundaries.

2. The affirmation of basic rights: understanding that people are separate beings and respecting that separateness.

3. Clarity through body language: people can repel or invite abuse by how they hold themselves.

4. The power of command: boldly speaking words of conviction to halt bullying, even when the speaker is afraid.

5. The power of two: one person standing up for a victim has a good chance of defusing the situation, but success increases dramatically when two or more stand together.
