

The Parable of the Talents

The parable of the talents, found in Matthew 25, provides an essential lesson on how we should utilize our

time, talents, and treasure. We are called to steward these gifts wisely, understanding that they have been given to us by God for a specific purpose. This parable teaches us that everything we have belongs to God and that we are accountable for how we use our resources. Time presents us with daily opportunities, our talents reflect our unique gifts and abilities, and treasure denotes our available resources.

Reflecting on the meaning of the parable, we are reminded of God's desire for us to invest in people. The ultimate goal is for people to come to know Him, and we are called to be part of that mission. Our efforts should yield a "return on investment" by helping others know Him better. We don't "give" to the kingdom of God (He already has everything), but we "invest" in it.

The parable of the talents challenges us to be faithful stewards of all that God has entrusted to us. May we be faithful servants who invest wisely in people and use our gifts to advance His kingdom.

How to Fight Viruses

Strengthen your microbiome



id you know that good gut health is essential for a strong immune system—and that to fight viruses, you need a strong microbiome? But what exactly is a microbiome?

Gastroenterologist Dr. Robynne Chutkan, author of *The Anti-Viral Gut: Tackling Pathogens from the Inside Out*, explains: "The gut microbiome refers to the trillions of organisms that live in and on our bodies, mostly in our GI tract. So, we're talking about bacteria, fungal organisms, parasites, viruses, and one-cell organisms called protozoa."

But what she first wants people to understand is that a large percentage of our immune system is located in the gut. "Trillions of microbes are there too," she says. "Think of the microbes as air traffic control for the immune cells. They are literally telling them what to do." She adds, "If you don't have as many of these good bacteria as you should, that signaling is not going to work."

So, how do we nourish our microbiome to combat viruses?

"You do need to eat lots of high-fiber foods," she says. "Bacteria take the fiber from plant foods, they metabolize it and ferment it, and create something called short-chain fatty acids. And these short-chain fatty acids are really important, not just for the health of the gut lining ... but also for modulating the immune system, for making sure when you're exposed to a pathogen, that your immune system mounts just the right response."

I am extremely fortunate to have grown up in an environment where I was surrounded by wonderful Christian examples and mentors, but nowhere was that more evident than at home. I was raised by two people who shared a strong faith and love for God, resulting in a supportive and loving Christian home.

My father was very well known within our denomination, spending much of his career serving and teaching others through music; later he worked in international development. However, there was never any mistake as to who was in charge at home!

My mother had a career as a very successful nurse. She spent a great deal of her time working in the operating room and later rose through the ranks to various positions of leadership. She handled that responsibility well, but her focus was always simple—to care for others.

She is quiet, soft-spoken, quite stoic at times, and to many, often seems to stay in the background. But the older I get, the more I realize what an influence she has had on me, my siblings, and now her 10 grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

When my father passed away suddenly in 2018 at the age of 69, my mother never faltered. The loss of her husband of almost 50 years was devastating, but she continued to be that stable presence of love in our lives, becoming an even stronger pillar of strength for our extended family.

She did this because she loves us, but that love for her family is rooted in her faith and her love for God. Without those lessons she taught us about family, integrity, and responsibility, I don't know where we'd be.

My mother is the perfect example of 1 Corinthians 13:4-7, which says, Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres (NIV).

As God created all things, He also created and ordained the family, and in so many cases a mother is its centre and heartbeat. Mothers care for their families with love and dignity, have the respect of others, and carry an incredible amount of responsibility.

They love us unconditionally, provide us with guidance, and are a blessing to all they interact with.

As we celebrate Mother's Day this month, remember to thank God for your own mother, for your grandmothers, your aunts, and for all those women who were a godly influence in your life, helping to shape who you have become.
