94% of young Canadian Christians surveyed say that their faith taught them to care about injustice and the most vulnerable.

Jesus taught us to love those less fortunate, but many young Christians in our country believe that the church is ignoring this message by not taking meaningful climate action.


Young Christians today see a clear connection between the climate crisis and global injustice, with vulnerable people disproportionately affected by environmental changes.





Who we surveyed. (Tearfund Canada & A Rocha Canada)

742 individuals from various Christian traditions in Canada. m=38%, F=60%. 26% were aged 18 to 24, and 74% aged 25 to 40. 65% attend church weekly with 78% attending at least once a month. 99% believe they have salvation through Christ, 98% consider the Bible to be the Word of God. 50% identify as evangelical.
