There exists what I call a secret kingdom. It is unknown—but known. It is not obvious on the surface of things but is underlying everything. So, my quest was to find out the laws of the secret kingdom that Jesus Christ had enunciated and to see how they pertained to human growth and development, to social organization, to politics, and to the affairs of nations.

Out of these revelations I was able to glean a list of ten overriding principles that I believe govern the success or failure of each human and every human organization. I call them the Ten Laws for Success.

Each week you will be introduced to a new law. Each law will have five sections for you to work through during the week:

Read the corresponding chapter in *Ten Laws for Success*.

Recite the selected verses aloud. There is power in the spoken word.

Reflect on and answer the questions given.

Rehearse by practicing the principles you learn.

Respond in prayer, asking God to help you in discovering His laws.

You can do one section each day or several at a time—whatever works for your schedule. The important thing is to take your time and allow the exercises to reach deep into your thinking. Try not to rush the process, but ask the Holy Spirit to guide you as you contemplate the questions and complete the activities.

May God richly bless you as you practice putting His laws of the kingdom to work in your life. May they lead you to a life filled with purpose and success as you seek to bring glory to God in the days ahead.



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THE LAW OF USE

The Law of Use is a fundamental principle governing growth and development, as exemplified by Jesus' parable of the talents. In this parable, three servants are given varying amounts of silver, and their actions reflect different attitudes toward what they have been given. The servants who invest and multiply the silver are rewarded, while the one who hides it out of fear is punished. This principle is not about material wealth but about the diligent, patient exercise of the gifts bestowed by God. It emphasizes that the use of these gifts leads to growth and abundance, while neglect leads to loss. This law applies to both physical and spiritual realms, affecting how we pray, read the Bible, and exercise our spiritual understanding.



READ: Refer to *Ten Laws for Success*, chapter 1, pp. 1–16.

RECITE: Read aloud these verses about using well what is given: Matthew 25:28–29, Mark 4:24–25, James 1:22–25, Luke 6:47–49.

REFLECT: Consider these questions:

1. Which servant in the parable of the talents best describes how you have used God's gifts?
2. Where have you seen the Law of Use demonstrated in your life?
3. Have you neglected any gifts? How would you change based on the Law of Use?
4. How would practicing the Law of Use change your life?

REHEARSE: Let's think of some practical ways that you can put the Law of Use to work in your life.

1. Gifts inventory: List your gifts and identify how to maximize one specific talent for God's kingdom.
2. Set realistic goals: Select an area where you've neglected the Law of Use, and ask for guidance to establish and realize goals.
3. Calendar appointments: Schedule time to apply the Law of Use to your goals, and keep those appointments.

God's way is gradual growth and maturity, and the Law of Use calls for setting realistic and challenging goals and sticking with them. The effective application of this law leads to personal development and spiritual fulfillment.

RESPOND: Take a few moments to ask God to help you understand and apply the Law of Use in your life.

Dear Lord,

Thank You for the wonderful gifts You have entrusted to my care. Please forgive me for any gift that I have neglected or been afraid to use faithfully. Please give me understanding and wisdom as I study Your Word, and teach me Your laws so that I might be a good and faithful servant. Lord, help me to set realistic goals, and give me the grace, strength, and perseverance to train myself and use the gifts You've given me. Please use me in Your plan and let me serve and glorify You. In Jesus' name. Amen.



THE LAW OF RECIPROCITY

The Law of Reciprocity illustrates the fundamental principle that what is sown will eventually be reaped. Every action we take has a consequence.

The Law of Reciprocity teaches us that treating others with kindness, empathy, and compassion initiates a chain reaction of good. By sowing seeds of goodwill through acts of generosity, support, and selflessness, you can significantly enhance your personal relationships, professional networks, and overall quality of life.

There is great spiritual blessing in living a life of reciprocity. By embracing its principles, you have the opportunity to change eternity for the lost, and experience a life characterized by abundance, fulfillment, and meaningful relationships.



READ: Refer to *Ten Laws for Success*, chapter 2, pp. 17–30.

RECITE: Each day this week, read the following verses aloud: Luke 6:38, Matthew 6:31–33, Isaiah 58:7–9, Proverbs 11:24, Malachi 3:10.

REFLECT: Consider these questions:

1. How have acts of reciprocity and kindness positively influenced my life in the past? How can I replicate that experience moving forward?
2. In what areas of my life do I struggle to embrace the Law of Reciprocity? Do my beliefs line up with what the Bible has to say?
3. What are some practical ways I can incorporate the Law of Reciprocity into my daily routine? How can I make it a habit to be more giving, supportive, and empathetic toward others?
4. How can I leverage the Law of Reciprocity in my professional life?

5. How can I expand my understanding of reciprocity beyond immediate relationships? Consider how your actions can inspire others to engage in reciprocal acts.

REHEARSE: Let's think of some practical ways that you can put the Law of Reciprocity to work in your life.

1. Start a gratitude journal.
2. Try random acts of kindness.
3. Approach networking with a genuine desire to learn from others.
4. Support a "kingdom cause" by volunteering your time or donating resources.
5. Use empathy: Put yourself in someone else's shoes to truly understand their perspective.

Remember, the key to incorporating the Law of Reciprocity into your life is consistency and a genuine intention to support others. By practicing these exercises and reflecting on your experiences, you will gradually cultivate a reciprocal mindset that brings abundance, fulfillment, and meaningful connections.

RESPOND: Take a few moments to ask God to help you understand and apply the Law of Reciprocity in your life.

Jesus, help me to live generously and to remember that You will supply all my needs according to Your riches. Thank You for the spiritual laws You have put in place in Your world. Help me to live out these laws and to realize the power and abundant life they bring. Make me a joyous and cheerful giver and use me in Your kingdom plan. Amen.

THE LAW OF RESPONSIBILITY

The Law of Responsibility builds on the teachings of Jesus, particularly the principle that much will be required of those who have been given much (Luke 12:48). It's closely connected to the Laws of Reciprocity, Use, and Perseverance and emphasizes accountability and stewardship. Recognizing the gifts and blessings that God has bestowed on us and utilizing them for His purposes is a central theme. Failure to do so leads to loss, while embracing responsibility prepares us for eternal work in heaven.



READ: Refer to *Ten Laws for Success*, chapter 3, pp. 31–33.

RECITE: Verses emphasizing the principle of responsibility: Galatians 6:7–10, Romans 12:6–8, James 4:17, Luke 12:47–48.

REFLECT: Consider these questions:

1. Demonstrate responsibility: How have you recently taken ownership of your actions? What impact did it have?
2. Areas needing responsibility: Where have you avoided responsibility? What can you do to embrace accountability?
3. Recurring patterns: Are there habits where you blame others rather than taking ownership? How can you shift your mindset?
4. Witnessing responsibility: Reflect on someone taking responsibility even when it was difficult. How can you emulate their example?
5. Gifts and blessings: What are the gifts and blessings that God has entrusted to you?

REHEARSE: Let's think of some practical ways that you can put the Law of Responsibility to work in your life.

1. Personal accountability: Reflect daily on choices and consequences. Identify actions to assume greater responsibility.
2. Honesty and integrity audit: Conduct a self-assessment to align actions with values, setting goals based on biblical principles.
3. Active problem solving: Shift focus from blaming to finding solutions, engaging in proactive thinking.
4. Reflecting on mistakes: Embrace responsibility for mistakes, transforming them into lessons and growth opportunities.

The Law of Responsibility is not just about individual growth but also about fulfilling God's purpose. It calls us to be thoughtful, honest, and proactive in our actions, aiming for personal growth and to make a positive impact on others.

RESPOND: Take a few moments to ask God to help you understand and apply the Law of Responsibility in your life.

Father,

You have entrusted so much to me, even the Gospel. Thank You for each gift and blessing I enjoy. Help me to remember they are intended to be used in Your service so that I will be inclined to live in the responsibility each one holds. Thank You for forgiving me when I have forgotten to use them in Your service, when my failure robbed You of Your glory. Strengthen my resolve that I may remember You always, the One to whom I will give account, so that I will have no reason to be ashamed in that great day of reckoning, and that in this day, people will see my good works and give You the glory. I ask You this in my Savior's lovely name, the name of Jesus. Amen.



THE LAW OF GREATNESS

Put yourself in Jesus' place on the last night of His life, knowing you would be dead by that time tomorrow! What would be going through your mind? Fear? Dread? The unfairness of it all? How would you act? Would you want to be affirmed in your mission, perhaps, or have extra attention heaped on you?

John 13:14-15 says that Jesus—knowing His time had come—took off His outer clothes, tied a towel around His waist, and washed His disciples' feet. Jesus explained why this was so important: *"If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you."*

Whenever the disciples discussed greatness, Jesus gave them one of two admonitions: become like a child; become a servant. The night He was betrayed, Jesus drove the point home. Jesus knew the disciples needed this tangible demonstration of how He viewed greatness.

His disciples would need to set aside personal agendas and be like Jesus, who said, *"The Son of Man came not to be served but to serve"* (Mark 10:45). This last demonstration locked that principle in, and these men went on to change the world.



READ: Refer to *Ten Laws for Success*, chapter 4, pp. 34–38.

RECITE: Each day this week, read the following verses aloud: Matthew 23:8-11, Mark 10:42-45, Philippians 2:3-8, 2 Corinthians 4:5; 1 Peter 2:16.

REFLECT: Consider these questions:

1. How can I use my unique talents and strengths to serve others?
2. In what ways can I expand my definition of greatness to incorporate acts of service?
3. Reflect on examples of individuals in your life who have embodied greatness through service. What qualities and actions did they exhibit?

4. How can I align my personal and professional goals with a greater purpose of serving others?
5. How can I cultivate a mindset of servant leadership and humility?

REHEARSE: Let's think of some practical ways that you can put the Law of Greatness to work in your life.

1. Volunteer: Seek out opportunities to volunteer for organizations or initiatives that advance God's kingdom.
2. Mentorship and guidance: Offer your expertise and support to someone in need of guidance or mentorship.
3. Listen and empathize: Practice active listening and empathy with others.
4. Practice gratitude and appreciation: Express gratitude and appreciation for the efforts of others. Acknowledge and thank those who have made a positive impact in your life.

True greatness is derived from making a positive impact, serving and uplifting those around you. Embracing the Law of Greatness creates a ripple effect of positive change, as your acts of service inspire others to give glory to God and to seek greatness through their own acts of service.

RESPOND: Take a few moments to ask God to help you understand and apply the Law of Greatness in your life.

Father,

Your definition of greatness is so radically different from mine. Thank You for how Jesus modeled true greatness for us, taking the lowest place though He was God in the flesh, humble enough to wash the disciples' dirty feet. Help me to live like that—and like Paul, a servant to others—for Jesus' sake.

Forgive me when I seek my greatness in accomplishment. Let me see my high calling in Christ. Conform me to His likeness. For I ask it in Jesus' name. Amen.



THE LAW OF MIRACLES

“Since God is almighty, the only absolutely free person in the universe, not bound even by His own creation, He is perfectly able at any time to change the way things are done. He can heal a body instantly; He can still a storm, and He can move a mountain. Those are miracles. Even then, however, He works within principles, and they frame the Law of Miracles.”—Pat Robertson in *The Secret Kingdom*

“Have faith in God.” This is the key to all miracles. We know that without faith it is impossible to please God. Jesus emphasized faith as the catalyst that leads to miracles: “If you have faith like a mustard seed, you can speak to the mountain”; “your faith has made you well”; “I could do no miracles there because of their lack of faith.” To see miracles, we must believe that with God, “all things are possible!”

There is a major hinderance to seeing miracles—unforgiveness. It blocks the way for miracles to occur. God is clear. We are to forgive others, because we have been forgiven.

In God’s kingdom, if we refuse to maintain an attitude of humility and harmony, we will block the flow of the miraculous in our lives.



READ: Refer to *Ten Laws for Success*, chapter 5, pp. 39–43.

RECITE: Each day this week, read the following verses aloud: John 14:12–14, Mark 11:22–26, Romans 4:20–21, Hebrews 11:6.

REFLECT: Consider these questions:

1. What are my beliefs about miracles? Challenge any doubts or unbelief opposed to believing that with God all things are possible.
2. How can I strengthen my faith to believe? Consider the direction found in Romans 10:17, Hebrews 10:23, 35, and 1 John 5:13–15.
3. What miracles have I already witnessed or experienced in my life? Use these as reminders of the power of God at work in your life.
4. Are there areas of my life where I need to surrender control to the Lord? Reflect on how relinquishing control and trusting in God’s plan can open the door for miracles.

5. How can I cultivate an attitude of expectancy and gratitude?
Practice expressing gratitude to God for both the ordinary and extraordinary. Building faith for future miracles.

REHEARSE: Let's think of some practical ways that you can put the Law of Miracles to work in your life.

1. Miracle journal: Start a journal and record instances of miracles, big and small, in your life.
2. Prayer of surrender: Acknowledge that there are certain aspects of your life beyond your control and entrusting them to the Lord.
3. Acts of faith: Step out in faith and do what God has already asked of you. Miracles can unfold as you actively participate in the process.
4. Community of believers: Seek out Christians who are active in their faith and are believing God for the miraculous.

The Law of Miracles describes the principles by which God, who has all power, performs miracles such as healing or moving mountains. Jesus taught that we must have faith in God to witness miracles. Faith is the catalyst for miraculous occurrences, affirming that all things are possible with God. Obstacles to experiencing miracles include unforgiveness and a lack of humility and harmony, which can block the flow of miraculous events in one's life.

RESPOND: Take a few moments to ask God to help you understand and apply the Law of Miracles in your life.

Dear Lord,

Thank You that You are a God of miracles! I believe with You all things are possible.

Please work in my life and increase my faith. Give me the grace to believe for miracles. Help me to forgive others, as You have forgiven me. Reveal any areas of unforgiveness in my life that I may confess those to You and be free. Thank You for leading me as a good Shepherd. Amen.

THE LAW OF UNITY

The Law of Unity is a reflection of the complex oneness of the triune God: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This law, foundational to any success requiring more than one person, promotes unity in thought and action.

The application of this law begins with unity in God through faith in Jesus, leading to a desire for God's will over our own. This unity underpins effective teamwork, setting aside personal agendas and desire for praise, undercutting divisiveness.

God tells us unity is good and pleasant. However, due to various reasons, unity is challenging to achieve and maintain. Paul urged the Corinthian church to be united in mind and judgment (1 Corinthians 1:10).

Why are there divisions and disagreements? James 4:1 identifies the cause as evil desires within us. True unity depends on being united to God and committed to His will, obedience, and humility. As we submit to God and consider others better than ourselves, unity thrives, bringing blessing and success.



READ: Refer to *Ten Laws for Success*, chapter 6, pages 44–48.

RECITE: Daily recite the verses emphasizing unity: Deuteronomy 6:4, John 17:11, 20–23, Ephesians 4:1–6, 1 Peter 3:8–9.

REFLECT: Consider these questions:

1. How have you built unity in your family, workplace, and church?
Are there instances where you have disrupted unity?
2. Compare experiences of unity versus lack thereof. What were your feelings and actions? How would you intervene if unity was breaking down?
3. Why is unity important to God?
4. How would consistent application of the Law of Unity improve your life?

REHEARSE: Let's think of some practical ways that you can put the Law of Unity to work in your life.

1. Ask God to bring to light any areas of discord with others and pray for a spirit of humility.
2. In instances where you may have not experienced unity, offer help to others and seek out commonality. Shared experiences provide a foundation to build from.
3. Make a list of your top priorities or goals for work, home, and finances. Ask for God's will and way over your own.
4. Grade your goals from 1 to 10 based on whether it aligns with God's Word. Rethink, and rework anything under 5.
5. As you read the Bible, make a practice of unifying your soul to His Word, responding out loud when you feel He is speaking directly to you— "Yes, Lord, I choose Your Word and Your way."

The Law of Unity promotes unity in thought and action as foundational for success and effective teamwork, emphasizing alignment with God's will over personal desires. Obstacles to unity arise from internal evil desires, but true unity is achieved through connection with God, obedience, humility, and selflessness, fostering blessings and success.

RESPOND: Take a few moments to ask God to help you understand and apply the Law of Unity in your life.

Father,

I am grateful that You have made me a member of the body of Christ. Forgive me for all the times that I have undermined unity through selfishness or pride. Always remind me that You have made us all one in Christ and have commanded me to maintain unity in the bond of peace.

Help me through Your Holy Spirit to demonstrate my oneness with other believers, for You have said our unity is a witness to the world that You have sent Your Son, Jesus. May the world be astonished at what You will do in and through the united body of Christ. For Your glory and in the name of Jesus I pray. Amen.

THE LAW OF PERSEVERANCE

The Law of Perseverance underscores the power of enduring challenges and setbacks. It teaches us to overcome obstacles, push boundaries, and achieve our dreams. As Pat Robertson suggests, perseverance refines our character, fostering faith, hope, and love.

Perseverance demands focus on the end goal, pushing past temporary setbacks. Embracing this law, we navigate challenges with resilience and determination, treating setbacks as growth opportunities. It encourages us to persist in faith and trust in God's promises.



READ: Refer to *Ten Laws for Success*, chapter 7, pp. 49–55.

RECITE: Daily recite the key verses: Matthew 7:7-11, Luke 18:6-8, 1 Corinthians 10:13, Galatians 6:9, James 1:4, and Romans 5:3-5.

REFLECT: Consider these questions:

1. How have you responded to challenges or setbacks? How has perseverance changed your outcomes?
2. How do your beliefs about adversity align with God's Word?
How could applying the Law of Perseverance improve your life?
3. How can aligning your efforts with God's will help maintain focus and motivation?
4. Who or what inspires you to persevere? How can you draw strength from these sources during difficulties?

REHEARSE: Let's think of some practical ways that you can put the Law of Perseverance to work in your life.

1. Regularly pray, asking God for guidance to overcome specific challenges and achieve desired goals.
2. Set milestones and track progress. Celebrate each milestone as a testament to your perseverance.
3. Seek feedback and learn from setbacks. Embrace criticism as a growth opportunity.
4. Cultivate a supportive network of like-minded individuals.
5. Develop resilience-building habits, such as regular exercise or journaling.

The Law of Perseverance teaches us that setbacks are not the end, but part of the journey. God uses our difficulties to grow our faith and build resilience. By overcoming challenges and building a positive mindset you can grow stronger perseverance. As you embrace the Law of Perseverance, God will help you reach success with courage and determination.

RESPOND: Take a few moments to ask God to help you understand and apply the Law of Perseverance in your life.

Lord, please give me the wisdom to know when, where, how, and what I should do when challenges come my way. Please let me live a life worthy of my high calling as Your child, and help me be victorious in You as I run my race. Amen.



THE LAW OF FIDELITY

Fidelity, or faithfulness, refers to the virtue of being true to our word and commitments. Rooted in Jesus's teachings, the Law of Fidelity is linked to the rewards God promises at the judgment seat of Christ. God, full of steadfast love and faithfulness, seeks faithfulness in His servants. As we grow in fidelity, we reflect God's nature and live out a law of success.



READ: Refer to *Ten Laws for Success*, chapter 8, pp. 56–61.

RECITE: Read the following verses daily: Exodus 34:5-8, Lamentations 3:22-23, Hebrews 3:1-2, 5-6, Luke 16:10, Matthew 25:20-21.

REFLECT: Consider these questions:

1. How does God's faithfulness inspire me?
2. How has inconsistency or a lack of faithfulness affected my spiritual growth?
3. How well do my actions align with God's Word?
4. Where have I been called to be faithful, and how am I doing?
5. Is it legitimate to serve the Lord with a view to reward? What Scripture supports my view?

REHEARSE: Let's think of some practical ways that you can put the Law of Fidelity to work in your life.

1. Set aside time daily for prayer and Scripture meditation.
2. Keep a gratitude journal, documenting God's faithfulness.
3. Find an accountability partner to support your journey toward faithfulness.
4. Practice keeping your word to God and others, aiming for respect and a good name.

Remember, God is the foundation of your journey toward faithfulness. With Him, you can walk faithfully toward success.

RESPOND: Take a few moments to ask God to help you understand and apply the Law of Fidelity in your life.

Father,

I praise You, for You are the faithful one. You have been true to every word You ever spoke and will be so through eternity. No promise of Yours has ever or will ever fail. You are most trustworthy. By Your Spirit in me, will You make me faithful—faithful like Moses, faithful like Abraham, faithful like my Lord Jesus? Holy Spirit, I pray You will ripen that fruit in my life. So much has been entrusted to me. I have been blessed in so many ways—may I prove to be trustworthy in all things. I long for You to find I have been a faithful servant and a faithful child of God in all my words and all my ways so that You will receive the glory that is due Your holy name. I ask it in my Savior Jesus' name. Amen.

THE LAW OF CHANGE

Embracing change is a vital aspect of growth, transformation, and success, as highlighted in Pat Robertson's Law of Change in his book *Ten Laws for Success*. Change can be challenging, yet it often leads to growth and greater opportunities, as illustrated in Jesus' teaching about new wineskins in Luke 5:36-39. By leaning on God's guidance and embracing change, we align ourselves with growth and fulfillment.



READ: Refer to *Ten Laws for Success*, chapter 9, pp. 62-65.

RECITE: Read these verses daily to strengthen your faith in God's transformative power: Jeremiah 29:11, Romans 12:2, Isaiah 43:19, Ephesians 4:22-24, 2 Corinthians 3:18, Romans 8:28, 2 Corinthians 5:17.

REFLECT: Consider these questions:

1. How do you respond to change? Are you open or resistant?
2. What significant changes have made a difference for you, and what did you learn?
3. Have you resisted change only to find it beneficial later?
4. What fears about change can you address with God's guidance?
5. How have you found God's purpose in sending change in your life?

REHEARSE: Let's think of some practical ways that you can put the Law of Change to work in your life.

1. Embrace discomfort by engaging in new activities.
2. Step out of your comfort zone and explore new things.
3. Pursue personal growth by identifying areas for improvement.
4. Let go of past hurts and embrace forgiveness.
5. Trust in God's guidance and meditate on His promises.

Embracing change with trust and openness unlocks doors of opportunity and success. Through prayer and practice, we can welcome change as a tool for personal development.

RESPOND: Take a few moments to ask God to help you understand and apply the Law of Change in your life.

Dear Lord,

Thank You that Your character never changes. Your love and mercy are constant, and You never lie or neglect Your promises. Thank You that You are committed to changing me. You have changed my destiny from hell to heaven, exchanged my sin for Jesus' righteousness, and changed my place from the kingdom of death to the kingdom of light and peace.

Please give me the wisdom to recognize and cooperate with the changes You want to see in my life. May I let go of unprofitable things and cling to the things that matter. I don't want to resist Your work in my life. I want more of You. Change me and make me more like Jesus. For Your glory, Lord. Amen.



THE LAW OF DOMINION

In the beginning, humans were created with authority over creation, but this dominion was forfeited when Adam and Eve succumbed to temptation. Jesus reclaimed this lost authority, teaching and demonstrating dominion over earthly and spiritual realms. Through Christ, we are called to exercise this dominion, to push against Satan's influence, and to utilize our God-given authority. Failing to exercise this dominion allows it to fall into disuse and vanish.



READ: Refer to *Ten Laws for Success*, chapter 10, pp. 66–76.

RECITE: Read aloud these verses on dominion and authority: Genesis 1:26–27, Psalm 8:3–9, Matthew 18:18–20, John 14:12–14, Ephesians 1:19–23, Philippians 2:10.

REFLECT: Consider these questions:

1. How do you perceive dominion and authority in your life? Have you been deceived or robbed of it?
2. When have you neglected your God-given dominion? What were the consequences?
3. How can you align your life with the authority God granted you in Christ?
4. Has either fear or doubt ever stopped you from exercising your authority? What could have been different?

REHEARSE: Let's think of some practical ways that you can put the Law of Dominion to work in your life.

1. Prayer of surrender: Seek God's guidance in areas where you desire to exercise His authority.
2. Scripture study: Explore verses about dominion and authority to deepen your understanding.
3. Daily words of truth: Create and repeat personalized messages that align with God's Word regarding dominion.
4. Identify areas for growth: Assess where you have not fully embraced your God-given authority and commit to change.

Recognizing and exercising the dominion and authority granted through Christ is vital for spiritual growth and fulfillment. Implementing daily practices and prayer can help in understanding and applying the Law of Dominion.

RESPOND: Take a few moments to ask God to help you understand and apply the Law of Dominion in your life.

Dear Father,

Yours is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, and You have graciously shared them all with me through Jesus. Help me to use this authority to promote Your kingdom, Your values, and Your Son. May signs and wonders accompany me as I bring Your kingdom message of salvation to the hurting people You lead across my path.

Keep me from a spirit of fear that may prevent me from speaking up when I ought. Instead, grant me the spirit of courage and a sound mind that I may always speak boldly for Jesus and the truth. In all these ways, I pray You will be glorified as I ask for them in Jesus' name. Amen.
