Here in Canada, we are in the thick of winter. It can feel like a dark and long season. So, let's start by taking a breath for a moment. Whatever

you're carrying into today, you don't have to hold it alone. God's faithfulness is not something you have to chase or prove; it is something you are invited to rest in.

We often expect faith to feel strong and certain, but sometimes it's simply choosing to trust God again when nothing seems different. Scripture reminds us in 2 Timothy 2:13, *If we are faithless, he remains faithful—for he cannot deny himself* (ESV). God's faithfulness is steady, not fragile. It doesn't rise and fall with our emotions or depend on how well we're doing spiritually.

There are seasons when God feels quiet and prayers feel unanswered. That silence can be unsettling. Yet God's faithfulness is not measured by immediacy. He is present in the waiting, working beyond what we can see—and shaping our trust in ways that last longer than quick solutions.

The story of Scripture is honest about human weakness and even more honest about God's character. People drift, doubt, and fall short, but God does not. His mercy is renewed, not rationed. *The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness* (Lamentations 3:22-23).

Today, let faith be simple. Place your life back into God's hands. You may not see the full picture yet, but you can trust the One who holds it—and who has never stopped being faithful.

Street ministry is one of my favourite things to do. Meeting people from all walks of life outdoors and sharing Jesus' love with them is refreshing.

One day, I met a visibly stressed young mother walking with her small children. I stopped her and asked if I could pray for her. With great relief, she sighed and said, "How did you know I needed prayer and someone to talk to today?" I replied, "God knew, and I am happy to be the one to pray for you."

After listening to her hardships, I shared my own struggles and how God rescued me. I then held her hand and prayed. Tears fell from her eyes as I led her and her children in a salvation prayer.

Luke 15:7 (NLT) tells us, *"There is more joy in heaven over one lost sinner who repents and returns to God than over ninety-nine others who are righteous and haven't strayed away!"* Heaven rejoices when one person receives Jesus as their Saviour. We should celebrate when the lost are found much like the father of the prodigal son who said, *"We had to celebrate this happy day. For your brother was dead and has come back to life! He was lost, but now he is found!"* (v. 32).

A LOVE THAT HEALS THE SUFFERING

Jenn was nervous when she was invited to a church conference by her friends. "I hadn't been in a church in 20 years," she explained.

Having been diagnosed with stage 3 Lyme disease, Jenn was in constant pain—and desperate for healing. "I wasn't able to bend my hands or touch my toes. ... I took dozens of medications," she said. "I lost two very big jobs due to anxiety, brain fog, and pain."

She was told by doctors there was no cure—that she would always feel this way.

When Jenn arrived at the BEHOLD conference—an annual event held by CBA's partner ministry, Disciple a City—she didn't see her friends, so she anxiously sat alone near the back row. A woman walking down the aisle stopped and asked if she could pray for Jenn. She hesitantly agreed, not sure what to expect. "I closed my eyes," Jenn said, "and I just felt the biggest weight lift off my shoulders."

When Jenn arrived back home, her husband immediately noticed a difference—and asked what had happened. "Nothing hurts," Jenn told him. "I didn't take my medication this morning. I do not feel sick. I feel no pain."

Overwhelmed by the love of her heavenly Father, Jenn now fervently shares her testimony of healing with others. "It is so real. ... *He's* so real. I don't know how to explain it."

A LOVE THAT REACHES EVERY NEED

Thanks to our partnership with Teen Challenge, 700 Club Canada is supporting vulnerable women through addiction counselling and spiritual growth.

Women whose lives were once ruled by trauma, addiction, and desperation have been totally renewed. In the chapel of the Teen Challenge Ontario Women's Centre, you'll see these women laughing with joy as they share their testimonies of radical transformation.

"I never imagined that my pain would turn into a purpose," one woman said. "Now, I get to walk with others and remind them there is hope beyond addiction."

This past Christmas season, residents enjoyed holiday festivities, participating in hot chocolate drives, Feast and Fun nights, and Bible trivia. Because of your support, these women are discovering the love of God—and that love is rewriting their stories.

Another woman shared, "When you find identity in Christ, then your identity is no longer in shame and trauma."

A LOVE THAT RESTORES THE BROKENHEARTED

Lynne and her husband, Mike, had built a joyful life together. Then, one day, Lynne's doctor called her with devastating news: "Your test results show that you have lymphoma... and there is no cure."

Lynne leaned on her husband for strength. But when she needed him most, tragedy struck again after he passed away during a fishing trip.

Alone in her grief, Lynne spiralled into months of crippling depression—until a friend invited her to church.

During an altar call, a woman prayed over Lynne, declaring, "God lives inside of you now. Cancer can't live where God

More Than Nice: The Usefulness of Biblical Kindness

When you hear the word *kindness*, what comes to mind? For many of us, it sounds like being “nice”—polite, agreeable, or smiling so that no one

gets upset. But being nice, although very Canadian, can stay on the surface. It dodges hard truths because we don’t want to offend, and we even confuse kindness with tolerance.

Scripture paints a richer picture. The biblical idea of kindness carries the sense of being “useful.” Real kindness serves another person’s good. It creates a safe space for transformation. It doesn’t ignore truth, and it doesn’t withhold grace. Instead, kindness weaves truth and grace together in a way that heals and restores. Kindness is saying what is true in a way that makes it clear you are for someone, not against them. It’s truth wrapped in love—correction in the context of care. That’s why kindness is powerful: It lets truth be seen, felt, and accepted.

When we’re unsure what this looks like, we only need to look at Jesus. He spoke truth people didn’t want to hear, yet they left knowing they were deeply loved. His kindness didn’t excuse sin; it lifted people out of it and pointed them back to God’s best. Romans 2:4 says it’s God’s kindness that leads us to repentance. Galatians 5:22 calls kindness a fruit of the Spirit. We must first receive His kindness, then extend it in our words and actions. This week, ask: How can I practice kindness in a way that’s useful for leading someone towards God’s truth and grace?

When the doctor later reviewed Lynne’s scans, the cancer was completely gone!

Lynne now serves in the healing ministry at her church, praying for others the way someone once prayed for her. “God heals broken hearts,” Lynne said. “He healed more than just sickness—He healed my soul.”

Growing up, Michelle never felt like she belonged. She desired acceptance, and it led her into drugs and partying.

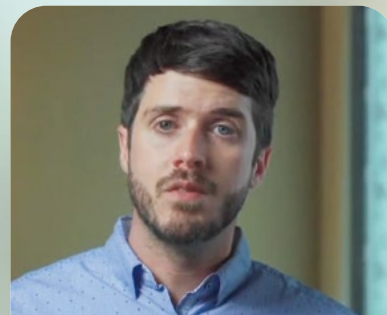
But one party turned into trauma, and she knew she wasn't the one in control. You won't want to miss her story of acceptance and love from an unlikely source.

There seems to be a chronic shortage of love across our country and around the globe, with turmoil caused by anger, antisemitism, prejudice, and hatred. As Christians, however, we have unlimited access to an eternal fountain of love that never fails or runs dry.

We read in 1 John 4:7-8, *Let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. ... Because God is love.*

And that's the love we need to share with our nation and the world today.

The Lord tells us in Hosea 6:6, *For I desire steadfast love and not sacrifice, the knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings.* The Hebrew word for "know" here means a very intimate knowledge, in which He wants to show His face to you.

God then goes on to say in verse 7, *But like Adam they transgressed the covenant; there they dealt faithlessly with me.* Let's not be like Adam and try to find excuses for the things that we have done wrong.

Instead, we need to turn to God and ask Him to search our hearts. Are we truly showing love to people—and not just to those who love us or are like us?

For Jesus plainly tells us, *Love your enemies! ... In that way, you will be acting as true children of your Father in heaven* (Matthew 5:44-45 NLT).

So let's come to the Lord humbly, confessing our sins and asking Him to forgive, cleanse, heal, and restore us. May He renew His covenant with us, lift up His countenance on us, be merciful and gracious to us, cause His face to shine upon us, and give us His peace. And may He use us to share His love with all the world, that people everywhere may come to know Him. God bless you!
